FROM THE PASTOR



One of the most anticipated events of the area will soon take place at Mount Zion. Every year people stand in long lines and nearly sit in each other's laps to enjoy the simple pleasure of our Ole Fashion Supper. Of course, lots of camaraderie and relationship development takes place as the cooks, servers, and miscellaneous volunteers interact to make it all happen. Besides that, each year the supper raises thousands of dollars. That money has been directed to our building fund for about as long as anyone remembers. But this year something is going to be different. Oh, we will still serve some of the finest barbeque ever provided by a pig, and there will still be banana pudding, country vegetables, fresh fried chicken, pork skins, fat back, etc. I hope that we still raise thousands of dollars too. The big difference is that this year we are giving away the whole profit of the Ole Fashion Supper! No, we're not going to make it a door prize one Sunday during worship! The Fundraising Team is partnering with the Missions Team to support the Raleigh Rescue Mission.

I am thrilled that we are taking this bold step. It represents the convergence of three of the values that make Mount Zion such a special congregation: outward-focus, action-orientation, and generosity. This demonstrates to our community that we are not self-absorbed, that we are willing to work hard to further God's kingdom, and that we understand cheerful giving. Beyond that, it also reminds us that we can trust God to provide. You see, this might seem like a bad time to be giving away proceeds that would have gone to the building fund (especially since we just established a Building Committee to develop plans for expansion of Mount Zion's facilities). But in God's economy, stinginess costs far more than generosity. As Paul reminds the believers in Corinth: *Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.* -2 Corinthians 9:10-11 (NIV-2010)

I have no doubt that God will provide for our needs when he can count on us as his instrument to meet the needs of others. So, lend a hand with the Ole Fashion Supper. Outreach, service, giving, and faith never tasted so good!

It happened this month...

Feb. 20, 1956 : Rev. J.D.A Autry and wife, Clara Willams Autry, deeded the land surrounding the church (2.4 acres) "for and in consideration of \$1.00 and other valuable considerations". After this generous gift, plans were made to Annex the Sanctuary. Trustees at this time were: Thomas McCullers, Durwood Johnson Sr., Alfred Taylor Sr., Dexter Penny, and Paul Johnson.

Feb. 1972: The youth choir, "The New Believers," presented a special program entitled "It's All About Love" to Mt. Zion, as well as neighboring churches. This group was directed by Mrs. Lou Johnson with Frances (Gulley) Liles as pianist.
