The Pastor's Page

Most people grow up learning a native language. Later we may learn other secondary languages, usually with much intentional effort, but we still speak and understand our native language best. If we try to communicate with someone who speaks a language that we don't, we are in for frustration and misunderstanding.

Gary Chapman in his book, *The Five Love Languages* argues that: "In the area of love, it is similar. Your emotional love language and the language of your spouse may be as different as Chinese from English. No matter how hard you try to express love in English, if your spouse understands only Chinese, you will never understand how to love each other." (p. 15)

So just in time for Valentine's Day, let's use Chapman's 5 categories to help us see how we can love as God wants us to. Please note, this article is not only for married couples, it is for everyone who wants to express love effectively, and that's something all of us want to do.

During his last meal with the twelve Jesus says, *A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.*—John 13:34-35 (NIV)

So, whether you're married or single, a child or a parent, young or old, you need to know how to speak the language of love.

Chapman says there are five basic ways we express and understand love. We can see each of these modeled in the life and ministry of Jesus.

Language #1: affirming words [See Mark 14:3-9]

- Saying, "I love you" not so much by speaking those words as by the kind of words you say.
- Giving compliments for what is good rather than just criticism for what is wrong.
- Speaking encouraging words—words that give another the courage to accomplish what they otherwise would not.

Language #2: quality time [See John 18:1-2]

- Quality time means more than just being together, it is giving someone your undivided attention.
- Some hints:
 - Maintain eye contact when the other person is talking.
 - Don't do something else while you listen.
 - Use active listening.
 - Observe body language.
 - Refrain from interrupting.

Language #3: tangible gifts [See Luke 9:12-17]

- In every culture across the globe and throughout the centuries gift giving is inextricably tied to expressing love.
- Even very young children pick flowers to give to their mothers, and their mothers feel loved.
- To give you must think about another and act on that consideration; gifts are visual symbols of love.
- To the person whose primary love language is receiving gifts, the cost matters little; it really is the thought that counts.

Language #4: acts of service [See John 13:3-5, 12-15]

- Loving by acts of service is doing things for the other person you know he/she would appreciate. For example: cooking a meal, setting a table, washing dishes, vacuuming, cleaning a commode, getting bugs off the windshield, taking out the garbage, changing the baby's diaper, painting a bedroom, dusting a bookcase, keeping the care running, mowing the grass, dusting the blinds, cleaning the fish tank, etc.
- But these actions need to be done to express love not out of a sense of guilt or intimidation.

Language #5: physical touch [See Mark 1:40-41]

- This is not limited to sexual touch for married couples, but caring, appropriate touch for anyone.

You likely operate most comfortably in one of these love languages and hopefully you can put your finger on it now. That's good information to know, but it is more important for others to know than you. The challenge is to learn to speak the other love languages fluently enough to get across Jesus' love and your love to others: husband, wife, children, relatives, neighbors, fellow-believers, non-believing associates, etc. I challenge you to take one or two of the languages that you are not very accustomed to speaking and say "I love you" to someone close to you in a way they can hear it.

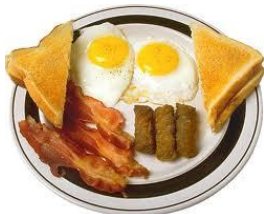
We participate in worship through:

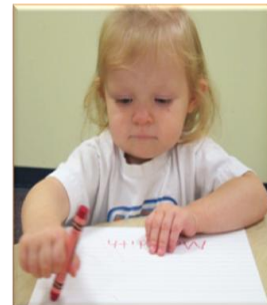

In addition, they offer services for displaced homemakers and ensure that those who are displaced as a result of a divorce, death, or separation can get the services they need to support themselves and their families.

Harbor House operates two upscale resale shops to provide profit for shelter programs as well as in-kind items such as clothing and household goods for those in need. Donations of gently used clothing, furniture and household items are always appreciated and tax deductible.

- The "Pizazz" Clayton store is located at 132 E. Main Street. They only sell women's clothing & accessories.
