## HeartBuilders Ministry



HOW MUCH do you value your relationships? I think most would respond with an answer of **a lot**. Many people seem to place substantial significance on their families and friends. Just look at the popularity of Facebook. But more importantly HOW DO you value your relationships? I think most would reply with an answer of **I don't know**. Many act like relationships just happen and assume they don't need any work. Just look at the divorce rate in America. So isn't it a shame that something like relationships which we value quite significantly are often ignored not because of their insignificance but because of our negligence? A new car has a better chance of long term survival than a new friend.

HeartBuilders Ministry was designed to teach people how to be in relationships. Its first conference *Oscar Winning Relationships* targets husbands and wives, who are the building blocks of God's family structure. The ministry believes a spouse should be considered an individual's MOST IMPORTANT relationship apart from their relationship with God. Its goal is to empower couples by teaching them some basic relationship building skills in an informal and entertaining setting.

Most weddings are well organized and amply financed to be a grand and glorious event but **last a day**. On the other hand marriages are often disorganized and poorly funded but are expected to **last a lifetime**. If couples would place more emphasis on their marriage than in their wedding, perhaps their chances for survival would increase!

On Saturday January 21<sup>st</sup> Mt. Zion UMC will be hosting the couple's conference *Oscar Winning Relationships*. Presenting the conference will be Dr. Eric W. Ewert who has recently graduated from Campbell University Divinity School and is the founder of HeartBuilders Ministries.

# FROM THE PASTOR

We're headed into 2012. What are you thinking and feeling as we enter that doorway? There is certainly plenty of uncertainty—in the economy, regarding the whole fabric of our nation, and of course our personal lives. The temptation is ever-present to worry or despair, yet hope, love, joy, and peace—the characteristics we reviewed during the lighting of the Advent wreath a few weeks ago—are what God intends for us. Where we focus our attention will determine where we end up. If we dwell on the problems or the threats, we will be overwhelmed, paralyzed, and defeated. On the other hand, if we concentrate on God—his promises, his power, his plan, his possibilities—then we will be confident and even excited. So, how do we focus our attention on God? That's a good question and not a new one. I want to challenge us to engage in an old practice that has been proven effective over the centuries.

Lisa Barnes writes in the *Dew4Him* newsletter: "Jesus did it. Daniel did it, so did Joshua, David, Judah, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Hannah, Anna, Paul and Peter. Although different circumstances, different lengths of time and for different reasons, all of these people in the Bible participated in the private discipline of fasting."

Fasting is simply intentionally going without food for a specific period of time for a spiritual purpose. So we're not talking about dieting or missing a meal because you're too busy to stop and eat. Christians, Jews, Moslems, Buddhists, and practically every religious group, practice fasting. Yet, fasting is not emphasized much in the Christian circles I have been a part of. I don't recall hearing any teaching about fasting until I was an adult and not much since. I don't know that I have ever preached an entire sermon on fasting before. Fasting doesn't fit well with our consumer culture. We are all about consuming, using, experiencing, enjoying, satisfying, relishing, tasting, and savoring. It is as foreign to us as kidney pie to talk about denying, delaying, declining, withholding, abstaining, refraining. But there are more than fifty references to fasting throughout Scripture.

Some instances in the Old Testament:

- Samuel leads the Israelites in fasting, confession, and repentance from following other gods. [See 1 Samuel 7.]
- Jehoshaphat calls the whole nation to fast and seek God as they come under attack from foreign nations. [See 2 Chronicles 20.]
- David fasts as he prays for his sick child. [See 2 Samuel 12.]
- Ester fasts and asks her people to fast before she pleads with the king for deliverance. [See Esther 4.]
- Daniel fasts as he intercedes for the restoration of the nation of Israel. [See Daniel 9.]

Some instances in the New Testament:

- Anna fasts and prays in the temple. [See Luke 2.]
- Jesus fasts before he faces Satan's temptations and enters His public ministry. [See Matthew 4.]
- Jesus assumes the continued practice of fasting. [See Matthew 6:16-18 and Matthew 9:14-17.]
- The book of Acts records how the first generation of believers fast and pray as they face big decisions. [See Acts 13 & 14.]

I challenge all of us, to engage in some kind of fast during the month of January. You can be creative with the what, when, and how long. Tailor your plan to your own health and schedule realities, but I challenge you to make a plan and do it. Consider some of the benefits of fasting:

1. Fasting provides more time and focus for prayer. Biblical fasting is almost always connected with prayer. We all spend a great deal of time buying, preparing, and consuming food. Fasting allows us to redeem some of that time for prayer. Also every twinge of hunger can become a call to prayer.
2. Fasting reminds us that we are to love God with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength. We often think of Christianity in spiritual, emotional, and intellectual terms and forget that God has claim to our body as well. There is something powerful about willingly denying our body something it craves as an act of worship.
3. Fasting purifies our bodies and our souls. I am told that fasting purges our bodies of toxins. More importantly, denying ourselves empties us of self and teaches us to be satisfied in God alone.
4. Fasting sensitizes us to the Holy Spirit. It is as though doing without, unclouds our spiritual vision. We become much more aware of God's love, power, and presence. We also become more conscious of our own sin.

Let's focus on God's possibilities for our own lives, Mount Zion, and his Church. Especially pray for the Spirit's guidance as we reach out with the good news of Jesus Christ, as we develop preliminary plans for facilities expansion, and as we seek to add a new staff member.

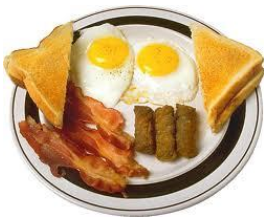

## Coffee And Fellowship for Everyone

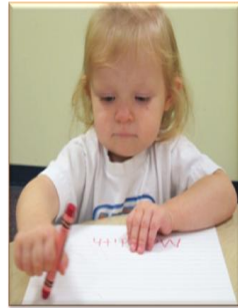

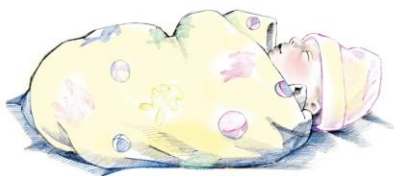

Looking back and looking forward

The Mt. Zion Building Team has had a busy year. Our first meeting was on Jan 27<sup>th</sup>. Our devotion came from Psalms 127: 1-2, with an emphasis on verse 1, "Unless the Lord builds a house, its builders labor over it in vain...". We talked about how important it is going to be for us to let God guide us in the project and that all we do as a committee and as a Church is being done to glorify Him.

Since that meeting:

- We toured several churches in the area to glean ideas for our project
- We were directly involved with the purchase of the new parsonage
- We have developed a plan for the conversion of the old parsonage to office and meeting space
- We have selected an architect to help us with the design and construction of our building project

As we look forward, 2012 will also be busy year. The architect has already started work on the preliminary plans for our project. Construction will begin soon on the old parsonage conversion. We will also be developing a plan for a capital campaign to finance our new building.

GS Architecture will be meeting with church members on Feb. 4<sup>th</sup> to gather ideas as they develop the preliminary plans.
